TPC ACTIVITIES

1) Interviews & Resume Writing Seminar:

Interview Process & Resume Writing Seminars were conducted by the Training & Placement Officer, Prof. A. Nagananda for all classes. The session highlighted the fundamental differences between a resume, a curriculum vitae and a bio-data. Common mistakes made by the students while structuring their resumes were addressed and rectified. The session was fruitful and provided an understanding of the perspective from which the recruiters view a resume. A part of the session was spent in analyzing the techniques to fill out a company provided bio-data form within a limited time frame.

- Reasons why candidates get rejected
- Pre-requisites for an interview
- Good practices to be followed
- Technical Interviews and their types

2) Code for Good Hackathon:

Date: 12th and 13th July 2014

Total Participants: Approximately 120

Number of Participants per Team: 6

Total Teams: 20

A 24-hour coding session was organized by J.P Morgan Chase, across colleges in Mumbai. The event is scheduled to be held in Bangalore in the coming two weeks. The students were shortlisted on the basis of their CVs and an Aptitude test. A total of 4 NGOs participated in the event:

- MagicBus

- NASSCOM
- Akanksha Foundation

The participants were asked to design a prototype of a solution which would solve a real life problem that the above NGOs were facing in their day to day operations. The students were provided the guidance and hospitality of the JP Morgan mentors and subject matter experts who volunteered their time over the weekend.

A total of 14 students were shortlisted from the institution for the final interview rounds after the contest. The same was held on 8th August and results are expected on 11th August. Our heartiest congratulations to the 10 students recruited by J.P Morgan Chase through this program.

3) Soft Skill Training Sessions:

VESIT (Training and Placement Cell) had organized two hour session on “Corporate Grooming & Etiquette, Resume Writing, Preparing Cover Letter, HR Round Interview and Group discussion” for final year students. The Speaker of this Session was Dr. Usha Kumari, who introduced us to basic ethics and norms that are to be followed while facing campus interviews. The students were taught about some good etiquette to be followed while attending interviews. Tips and guidelines for attending HR interview were also dealt in detail. A mock HR round interview was also shown. Few frequently asked questions and the effective answers for those questions were discussed. Different formats for building a resume were discussed. The session concluded by analysing group discussions, how to take part in group discussion, Dos and Don'ts in group discussion.

PLACEMENT RULES

- Each student will be eligible for Two Jobs / One dream job. If the company insists that the students should not be allowed for second offer, the selected students will be out of placements and should give the same in writing prior to appearing for the process.
- Students who are interested in pursuing post graduate studies during the academic year 2015-2016 will have to submit the same as a declaration in writing. Students who submit the declaration will be given the required assistance to complete the post graduation admission process.
- Students will be allowed a maximum of 3 attempts for their second job. Students selected in core branch Company will not be allowed to appear for non-core based company for their second job.
- The name of the student should appear on the selected list of the second company irrespective of the order in which the process takes place. On getting the second offer, the first offer stands cancelled and the first offer letter is to be returned.
- Students must update their resume as and when applicable. Incomplete resume will not be forwarded. All information given in the resume should be correct. The college will not be responsible for any errors
- Only those students who satisfy the cut-off criteria and are interested should appear for the campus placement.
- Students have to register their names with the placement coordinators for a given company. Eligible students who are not placed are considered as registered by default. If not interested they should inform the coordinators. Once having registered the students have to attend the pre-placement talk (PPT). After deciding to sit for the aptitude test, students cannot back out of the selection procedure.
- Students are requested to see the notice boards and the mails on respective e-groups. The responsibility of placement coordinators will be only restricted to giving messages in classroom and on e-groups.
- Students should be either in the classroom / labs or in the selection process while in college on the day of interview.
- Only the placement coordinators are allowed to interact with the company representatives. Students are not allowed to meet the company representatives without the permission of the placement officer.

- The students should ensure at least 75% attendance in all subjects. (Class missed for Campus Placements will be marked as absent).
- If a students' name appears in the critical defaulters list, then the company in which the student is placed will be informed accordingly to reconsider the offer and the student will be blacklisted from further Placement.

Note:

- ***Students who do not follow the above rules will be blacklisted from the placement procedure. Any other case will be treated as special case and the placement cell will take the necessary action.***
- ***All decisions of the placement officer will be final and binding on all.***

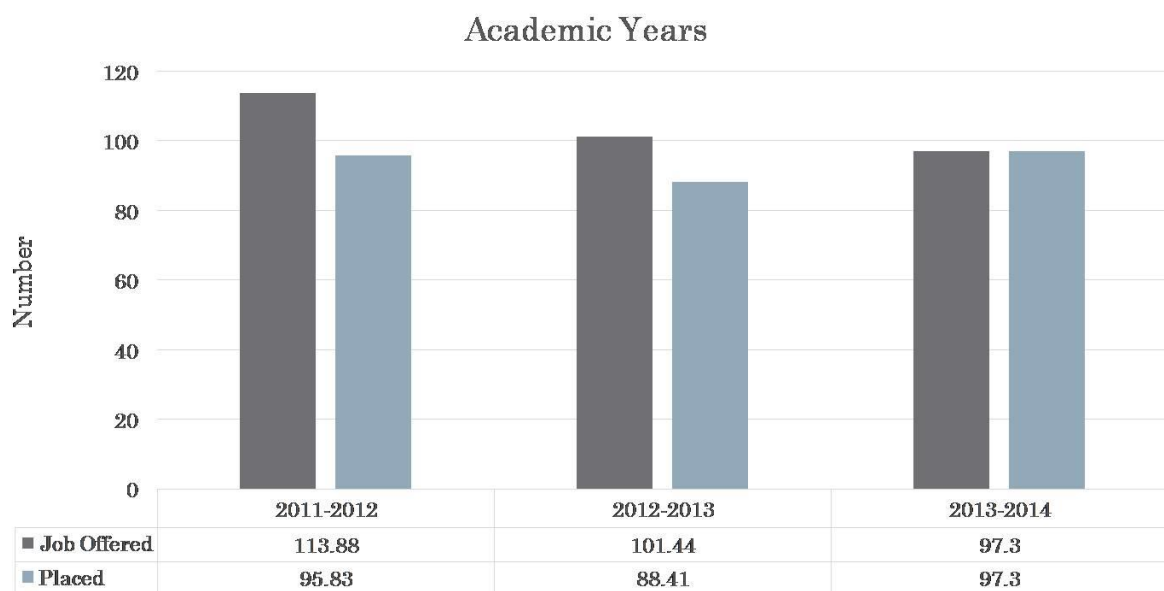
